## Recovery of a Grasshopper Sparrow band from a Kestrel Nest Box

On 17 June 2021, while analyzing prey remains in a kestrel nest box just south of Broadway Virginia, we found the leg bone of a banded bird. Bird Banding Laboratory reported the band had been placed on a Grasshopper Sparrow (*Ammodramus savannarum*) on 17 November 2019 near Naples Florida, over 1400 km (875 miles) south of its recovery location.
